Hug Ball Necklaces are a popular Rollo Room Palanca. Pieces of yarn are tied together to form a ball and strung on a necklace. When hugs are exchanged, each person pulls out a piece of yarn from their ball and ties it onto the necklace of the other person. These were often given after the Sacraments Rollo during which "Abrazos" are explained. By the end of the weekend, there are lots of pieces of yarn tied around the necklaces representative of God's unconditional love shown between friends.

One Pastor's Response to UEC

Pastor Dan Johnson of Plymouth Covenant Church attended UEC in February. Here is his response as printed in the Plymouth Covenant Church newsletter for his congregation to read:

Convenor's Corner

It seems timely to do a broad overview of what the UEC Council has been working on for the past several years. The process started with the commissioning of a Long Range Task Force to identify the strengths and weaknesses of UEC, and suggest ways to improve it. Additional input was sought from members of the clergy and 4th Day Community. These recommendations were then prioritized and actions taken to refine and implement changes that strengthen UEC's ability to spread the message of God's unconditional love for his people. To improve UEC's image and to more effectively communicate, the Palanca Press was given a new look. A promotional DVD was created and distributed containing testimonials of 4th Dayers and clergy. The UEC web site is in the midst of a make over. The database is being updated. Measures have been taken to make the allocations policies less restrictive. Additional promotional materials are being developed. As change continues to occur, you can keep informed by reading the Palanca Press and visiting the UEC website.

The UEC Council operates in a manner very similar to a weekend team. Everything is girded in prayer. Piety, study, and action are underpinnings of the council structure. Grace is freely offered and regularly demonstrated. At every meeting palanca is given and received; cards, letters, and prayers are given; food, beverage, and sometimes chocolate are received.

We encourage all members of the 4th Day Community to keep informed and stay involved. Form or rejoin a renewal group. Serve on a team. Sponsor someone through a weekend. Support the weekends through prayer, service, and palanca. If you need prayer support, contact the council liaison. We have a very active 4th Day prayer chain that is willing to hold you up in prayer.

Juspiration

Learning to Fly

Sometimes I feel that my life is a series of trapeze swings. I'm either hanging on to a trapeze bar swinging along or I'm hurtling across space in between bars. Most of the time, I feel carried along at a steady rate of swing and feel in control of my life. But once in a while, I look ahead of me into the distance, and what do I see? I see another trapeze bar swinging toward me. It's empty, and I know, deep in my spirit, that this new trapeze bar has my name on it. It is my next step, where God wants me to go. I must release my grip on the present to go where He wants me, where He will use me.

Each time, I am filled with fear. It doesn't matter that in all my previous hurtles across the void between bars ... I have always made it. Each time I am afraid I will be crushed on the unseen rocks in the bottomless chasm below. But I do it anyway. THIS IS FAITH. I know God carries me across the void to the next bar. So, for an eternity that can last a microsecond or a thousand lifetimes, we soar. Me and God.

God can truly change us only when we totally let go and surrender ... and when we are hurtling through a void, we have no choice but to rely on God. This is when I grow. This is when He teaches me, prepares me, when He has me in the palm of His hand. We are focused on moving from one place to another, from one calling to the next. But the real transition is that of moving from fear to TRUST. Hurtling through the void, God is teaching us to fly.

If we don't soar with Him to the next bar, He cannot use us for His work, to futher His Kingdom ... and this is what it is all about. So don't be afraid ... Trust.

Unidos en Cristo Policy Change Spouse Attendance Recommendation

(approved by UEC Council—April 2009)

After over a year of prayer, research, discussion, prayer (and did I mention, prayer?) your UEC Council made the decision in April to NOT require couples to attend a pair of UEC weekends together. The new policy reads:

"For married couples, it is customary and strongly recommended that both husband and wife attend UEC together on a set of weekends."

Publications such as the Weekend Application, "UEC and the Married Couple" brochure and the document "Allocations Policies & Appeal Process" have been updated to reflect the change. All are available at the web site.

It is the responsibility of the Sponsor to communicate this recommendation to couples seeking to attend UEC. This can be accomplished by sharing with them the brochure "UEC and the Married Couple."
