Been to prison lately?


There is great joy in being along side a prison inmate when he or she experiences the truth of 2 Corinthians 5:17: "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation."

Convenor's Corner

I am a soccer official and a girl's lacrosse official. My job is to enforce the printed rules, and determine where the

grey areas are and use a bit of common sense

Probably one of the things I hate to do is enforce <u>certain</u> uniform rules because they seem somewhat ridiculous to me. Some, once discussed with a peer, make more sense and there becomes an "ah-ha!" moment.

Working on teams for a UEC weekend can be much like that, especially when it comes to the number of times one serves in a year or the different leadership positions into which one might step.

Certainly every new weekender should be encouraged by their sponsors and others to raise their hand to serve on a weekend sometime shortly after their own weekend. That's easy and makes sense.

Where the "sticky wicket" comes in is when we have dedicated, well-meaning Cursillistas who serve, and serve and serve without regard to the printed parts of the manual that encourage working only one team a year, and certainly not back-to-back teams in the same leadership roles (except to gain experience in other team leadership roles).

This is where it becomes awkward for the Council as conversations must be had to explain the purpose behind the rules/encouragements.

Okay, so imagine this scenario: a group of Cursillistas who all know each other and have leadership experience fill the teams for a year.

The teams are comprised of the same people, though they may change positions within that year. What opportunities lie for the nearly 60 people (assuming full weekends) for each of the weekend pairs to serve on a weekend (by the way, that's 180 people)? None, absolutely none.

The rules for serving aren't merely put there for the heck of it. Remember, this movement has been around for some 30 years, and we want to keep it vibrant and growing.

There is a prescribed "Cursillo method" though certain parts of it have morphed due primarily to electronics, diets, etc.

Other church-type events as well as the busy-ness of people's lives have impacted the numbers available to attend UEC weekends. Our churches and pastors are ever changing. Liaisons and others change churches, affecting UEC directly.

It's highly critical that newly-acquired Cursillistas have the opportunity to serve to help keep the UEC body growing, to maintain its vibrancy, to give back, and share their love for Jesus.

Choosing to ignore rules and guidelines tends to put the "spotlight" on YOU and your wants and desires and not always what's best for the weekend or weekenders. It also forces Council to have unpleasant

conversations and perhaps be the "enforcer" of rules ignored.

Yes, there is a 70%/30% guideline about "new" people on a team and those experienced. That is for the rector/as to follow.

But you who are experienced team Cursillistas need to be okay with choosing to help behind the scenes if you have already served a weekend in the year. You have to be willing to say "I'm grateful you have asked but I have served this year" and "please give new weekenders an opportunity first."

The Council understands a person's desire to serve and by no means intends to judge a person's heart to serve, but when the rules – written or implied – are blatantly ignored, then the Council must step in.

An alternative for you to spread out your gifts for service: consider other Minnesota Cursillo movements, including TEC (Teens Encounter Christ) and Charis. There are links to both on the UEC website.

If you are a new Cursillista and if you have not raised your hand to serve, the Council hopes you will prayerfully consider doing so.

Christ is counting on YOU to share His love with others. Serving on a UEC weekend is a way you can do so, a way you can give back the gift of His love in the same manner it was given to you on your weekend.

Thank you for your heart to serve. Thank you for being the hands and feet of Christ.

UEC 4th Dayer detained in Rwanda

Esther Nyiransabimana-Myers, UEC #230, who has been incarcerated in her home country of Rwanda since January, 2015. Esther has served on teams following her initial weekend in 2008.

Esther has been incarcerated since January 19, 2015, and only this past week has been charged. A trial date has been set for July 6.

This is the list of charges;

1) negationism and minimization of the genocide against the Tutsi;

2) inciting insurrection or trouble amongst the population;

3) public insult

The following is a summary of events which have taken place:

Nov. 13, 2014 - Esther, her husband, Kevin, and their son 4 year old son, Tyrell, traveled to Rwanda for ministry and time with family. Esther has lived in the United States since 2007 and is a permanent resident. This was her first

trip back to Rwanda since coming to the United States.

Jan. 18, 2015 - Esther preached at a church in Kigali.

Jan. 19, 2015 - Esther went with police to answer questions about her sermon. She has been incarcerated since that time.

February, 2015 - Esther was moved to Kigali's Central Prison. She remains in the Central Prison in Kigali.

Esther's husband and son came back to the United States the beginning of March.

The legal process has been very frustrating and very slow moving. A very experienced attorney has recently received approval to be Esther's new council. He has begun launching a defense. This was a major breakthrough as it took 3-4 weeks for the process to be approved.

Specific prayer requests:

• for God's wisdom, grace and mercy

to prevail

- for the new attorney, who is very experienced, to have wisdom and be effective in his work to bring justice for Esther
- for Esther's state of mind and heart to be encouraged in this difficult situation
 - for justice to prevail in Rwanda

Esther has many testimonies of prison ministry. She remains totally in God's hands and needs our prayers just as much now as ever. Please continue to lift Esther up for God's grace to cover her and God's will to be done.

The family extends their thank you for your prayer support. They are thankful for your faithful prayers, emotional and financial support. They know God is creating a testimony in Esther that will bring glory to his name!


