
NEW Trailer Storage Facility sought



Convenor's Corner

On the fourth Tuesday of each month, our UEC Council gathers at Christ Presbyterian Church in Edina. Our evening begins with prayer, a meal, devotions, and then our business meeting. It's been a long-standing tradition for us to start our meeting with our name, our church, our role on Council, and an answer to the ice-breaker question for the month. As new Council members join us and old friends leave, this has given us the opportunity to get to know each other.

As the Convenor, it is my responsibility to choose that question this year. September was a pretty uneventful question – "What do you hope that the Council will accomplish this year and what are you willing to do to make that happen?" When the 4th Tuesday in October approached, I began searching the internet for "Christian" ice-breaker questions. As you might be able to guess, there is an abundance of material available with the click of the mouse. After wading through a multitude of superficial questions, I settled on, "What is the most difficult thing you've ever done, and how did God see you through it?"

As we went around the table sharing those low points in our personal journeys, it reminded me of the obvious - that God always has and always will place people in our paths at just the right time, providing us with exactly what we need to get us through the difficult times. I was honored by the trust, honesty, and openness of the sharing that was done (although they did whine a LOT about the question). God has gathered this group of people to serve as your UEC Council. As I listened that night in October, it reminded me of Matthew 25:31-36, and Jesus' loving response, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." Each of us has been on the receiving end of that gift of love and grace.

With 2013 already underway, many of us have given some thought to that list of things that we'd like to accomplish or commit ourselves to this year. What we really need is to remember to do two things: Love God with all that we are, and love our neighbors as much as we love ourselves. This is all that really matters. As we go about our busy, jam-packed schedules, may we not just notice those who need God's love and grace, but may we put aside our own needs and wants to respond to others. I pray that we, the 4th Day members of Unidos en Cristo, go about our year, bringing the love of Jesus into the lives of everyone we come into contact with. Lessons While Building a House

As many of you already know, for just over a year now we've been working on an addition to our house. There was a need in our family, and we felt that we were in a position to do something about it. So the building began.

My husband had been in construction for a number of years and was able to draw the plans. He has the ability to "see" the house before it ever existed. I wasn't able to do that. I had to trust that it would come together in just the right way. (Blueprints are not my area of expertise.) He had the "master plan," something that is mandatory for the success of a project of this size.

Because of his experience as foreman on many large projects, he knew when to order materials so that they would be available to the workmen when needed. Sometimes the places from which we ordered looked at him like he was crazy - even said so. But we never lost a day of work because we were waiting for materials. There were times it seemed things arrived at the last minute, but the truth is that they always arrived at just the right time. Have you noticed that God does the same thing? He makes sure we have what we need precisely when we need it.

Even with my hubby's background, he was willing to listen to and learn from those around him. He understands Canadian law and codes well, but Minnesota is another story (we have very strict codes). So he got to know the folks at City Hall well (he's on a "first name" basis with them) - some of them even "dropped by" in no official capacity just to see how things were going. Age and experience aside, there's always something more that we can learn. Don't let pride or experience get in the way - learn the rules and follow them.

As I observed our workers, I realized that it was in their (and our) best interests to clean up each day (if not more often). Leaving excess materials lying around made for an unsafe workplace. If the material was still usable it was stored in a certain area for that purpose. Dumpsters became our friends - especially when there was old siding or other materials to be gotten rid of. How often do we allow the "clutter" of the past to keep us from doing our best work in the present?

One more, very important thing: Pray about everything - God cares about what is of concern to you. I Peter 5:7 (NLT) says "Give all your worries and cares to God, for he cares about you." He will always be there for you, no matter the situation in which you find yourself. You can always rely on Him. He's got your back. Our Father has a plan for each of us - we can rely on Him for the finished product (Jeremiah 29:11 - 13).

Unidos en Cristo Age Requirement Changed

(approved by UEC Council November, 2012)

While the official wording is yet to be finalized, UEC Council voted to reduce the minimum age of a Weekender from 21 years to 18 years and no longer attending high school.

Over the years, teenagers who have been involved with TEC (Teens Encounter Christ) have had a three-year gap between the ages of 18 and 21 during which they were unable to participate in either organization. Having ended service with TEC at 18, they are unable to serve on a UEC weekend until they are 21. In addition, Council will highly encourage these young adults to attend UEC as a Weekender before serving on a UEC team. TEC and UEC differ enough that this experience will not only be valuable to their adult life as a Christian, but will lend experience towards serving on a UEC team as well.

Songbooks for ALL Weekenders

Also as of the January / February 2013 weekends, songbooks will be given to each person attending the weekend whether single or part of a couple. The elimination of confusion in giving only one book per couple will be worth the small extra cost.

NEW Rector/a Mentor Program in Pilot Stage

Beginning with the June Rector and Rectora, Council will prayfully choose, call, train and assign a mentor to each Rector and Rectora.

Menors will be people who served well as Rector/a in the past, have shown understanding and support for the cursillo method (WHY we do things the way that we do and WHY it should not be changed without consideration), have knowledge about and embrace the leadership development process embedded in the cursillo method and have a strong desire to see cursillo and UEC continue. They will also be people who demonstrate on a regular basis the Life of Grace in their personal lives and in their communities.

Their duties will be two-fold. First, to pray with, encourage and guide the Rector/a as they pray, ponder and prepare for leading a UEC weekend. Second, to join the recruiting process for leadership and team, helping to build a team that is qualified and helping to appoint people that need to serve in various areas in order to be developed for leadership.

As with most changes in UEC, this program will be tried and purified over the next couple of years. If you have questions about this program, please contact a Council member.
